

Drilling underway on shallow gold targets at Pinjin Gold Project

Kalgoorlie Gold Mining (**ASX:KAL**) ('KalGold' or 'the Company'), has commenced an aircore drill program at its Pinjin Gold Project. Following the drill rig's arrival on schedule on Wednesday afternoon, drilling began yesterday morning on the Wessex shallow gold target. Four drill holes were completed for 342m on the first day (Thursday).

The new drill program is testing the extension on to KalGold's ground of historically drilled, shallow gold mineralisation from Hawthorn Resources' (ASX: HAW) adjacent Mining Lease. The program will test both Wessex and Harbour Lights targets.



Drilling the first hole (PSAC24001, above) of the new, low impact aircore program at the Wessex target, Pinjin Gold Project. Spoil from the hole is shown (below) at the 53m mark, with the hole ending at 78m depth. The program will test both the Wessex and Harbour Lights targets adjacent to the tenement boundary with Hawthorn Resources' Trouser Legs Mining Lease, where significant gold mineralisation has been intercepted at shallow depths not far from the boundary (see KalGold ASX announcements dated 3 April 2024 and 23 May 2023 for more details).



KalGold's objective is to begin assessing additional targets for shallow gold resource definition and development, beyond those initially drilled on the Pinjin Gold Project at Kirgella Gift and Providence. The Kirgella Gift and Providence targets are the focus of resource modelling to define the Company's initial JORC Code (2012) Mineral Resource Estimate at Pinjin. KalGold's goal is to define shallow gold ounces amenable to open pit mining.

The Pinjin Gold Project is located around 150km east of Kalgoorlie Boulder and covers a substantial portion of the southern part of the prolific Laverton Tectonic Zone. To the north, this major crustal structure hosts some of the Eastern Goldfields' largest gold mines and deposits.



ASX-listed resources company Kalgoorlie Gold Mining (KalGold, ASX: KAL) is a proven, low-cost gold discoverer with a large portfolio of West Australian projects, focussed on:

- The Bulong Taurus Project, 35km east of Kalgoorlie-Boulder, contains the outcropping La Mascotte gold deposit as well as a series of satellite prospects and historic workings of the Taurus Goldfield. Importantly, KalGold's methods resulted in the definition of a JORC resource estimate (3.61 Mt @ 1.19 g/t Au for 138,000 oz¹) that is one of the most inexpensive in recent times (A\$4.60 per ounce of gold). Exploration work continues at the project.
- The Pinjin Project within the 30Moz Laverton Tectonic Zone (host to Sunrise Dam, Granny Smith, Rebecca, Anglo Saxon, and Wallaby projects) is located only 25km north along strike from Ramelius Resources (ASX: RMS) Rebecca Gold Project. With historic work identifying open gold mineralisation from shallow levels, immediate work is focused on testing mineralisation continuity. At Kirgella and Pinjin South, tenure is the subject of a farm-in over the next two years to expand upon known mineralisation. Between this tenure and KalGold's existing tenure and applications, the Company has established a significant presence in a strategic and important region.
